## COSTS JUDGMENT OF CHIEF JUDGE G L COLGAN

[1] Following the conclusion of appeals in this matter in the Supreme Court, OCS Limited (OCS) has now applied for an order for costs against the plaintiffs. It seeks a contribution to its legal costs and disbursements of \$11,000.

[2] The defendant says that its actual legal costs were \$17,500 so that a contribution of \$11,000 is a reasonable one to costs reasonably incurred.

[3] Each party was partially successful in this Court: the plaintiffs were found to be entitled to "redundancy entitlements" but the defendant was successful in

resisting their claim to monetary redundancy compensation. That is still the final position after the Supreme Court's judgment.

[4] The case was truly a test case of previously uninterpreted and equivocal statutory language as has been illustrated by appeals to both the Court of Appeal and the Supreme Court. Both parties (and others) have benefited in establishing their legal positions.

[5] Although costs usually follow the event, the event in this case saw the spoils shared largely equally. For that reason, and also because this was truly a test case of new legislation, I decline to make any award of costs to any party. All must bear the legal costs and disbursements they have incurred.
