ORAL JUDGMENT OF JUDGE BS TRAVIS

- [1] I am satisfied, for reasons that I will give in writing as soon as I am able, that the lockout which commenced at 6 pm on Thursday 24 September 2009 is unlawful.
- [2] The plaintiff is therefore entitled to the injunctive relief it has sought.
- [3] An injunction will issue restraining the defendant from locking out employees pursuant to its notice of 9 September 2009 or any other lockout notice intended to compel members of the plaintiff to accept individual terms of employment.
- [4] Costs are reserved.

[5] I note that this is the final relief and not interim relief and there is	is therefore
no need to make the injunction conditional on any undertaking as to dame	ages which
would be required from a plaintiff seeking an interim injunction.
