**INTERLOCUTORY JUDGMENT OF
CHIEF JUDGE CHRISTINA INGLIS
(Application for continuation of freezing order)**

[1] On 14 April 2022 I granted an application for freezing and ancillary orders against Mr Munro, a former employee of Solander Maritime Ltd.¹ The freezing order was to have effect until 29 April 2022, unless on that date it was continued or renewed. The order also required that an affidavit be filed and served in respect of the existence, nature, value and whereabouts of the respondent's assets. An unsworn affidavit has been provided; a sworn one has not.

[2] The parties have filed a joint memorandum seeking a continuation of the freezing order to 27 May 2022. The parties also seek revised orders in relation to the filing and service of the affidavit referred to above. The respondent's wife, who is a co-owner of a property subject to the freezing order, consents to the continuation of the freezing order.

[3] By consent, I continue the current freezing order to **5.00pm 27 May 2022**, and order that the respondent must file and serve a sworn affidavit in compliance with the freezing order by **5.00pm 4 May 2022**.
