COSTS JUDGMENT OF JUDGE K G SMITH

- [1] In a determination of 22 June 2023, the Employment Relations Authority held that the Port Hills Foundation Charitable Trust was to pay Ali'itasi Luamanuvae-Su'a the following sums:¹
 - (a) \$2,925 gross for unpaid notice.
 - (b) \$8,000 compensation under s 123(1)(c) of the Employment Relations Act 2000 (the Act).

Luamanuvae-Su'a v The Port Hills Foundation Charitable Trust [2023] NZERA 328 (Member Baker).

\$9,450 gross for 12 weeks of lost earnings under s 128 of the Act. (c)

\$1,016.56 gross for holiday pay under s 23 of the Holidays Act 2003. (d)

[2] Subsequently, the Authority ordered the Trust to pay to Ms Luamanuvae-Su'a

costs of \$1,925 and to refund the filing fee of \$71.55.²

The Trust sought to challenge the Authority's determinations but did not do so [3]

within the time allowed by s 179(1) of the Act. It applied for an extension of time.

That application was opposed by Ms Luamanuvae-Su'a who also applied to strike it

out.

[4] Directions were made for the application for an extension of time to be argued.

The Trust did not file submissions but Ms Luamanuvae-Su'a did. On 22 February

2024, the Trust abandoned its application.

[5] Ms Luamanuvae-Su'a seeks costs and has filed submissions to support an

award of them. Despite being provided with opportunities to respond to the costs

application the Trust has not done so.

I proceed on the basis that Category 1A is appropriate given the issues raised [6]

by this proceeding.³ Using that Category, costs amount to \$2,703. That sum is

appropriate.

Conclusion

[7] The Trust is to pay Ms Luamanuvae-Su'a costs of \$2,703.
